Ann “Annie” Carolyn Fisher, 67, of Monrovia, passed away on Saturday, July 3, 2021, while visiting her home away from home that she had purchased in Sayulita, Mexico. She was born in Greensburg, Indiana, on February 1, 1954, to the late Bill Fisher and Martha (Van Den Bosch) Fisher, who survives.

Raised in a rural farming community of small-town Monrovia. Ann shared her childhood with her brother, Jeff and younger sister, Janet. A vibrant and friendly independent woman, Annie lived free and full, and was thankful to live a life that included leisure. She was true to learn and grow and was in tune to know thy self. Above all, she loved to spend time with family; to who her love was limitless and equally shared with all.
