



Arnold Pritt

October 14, 1943 - December 26, 2022

Arnold “Arnie” Lee Pritt, 79, of Monrovia, completed his earthly journey, entering the gates of Heaven in the early morning hours of Monday, December 26, 2022, while in the comfort of his home. He was born in Burnwell, West Virginia on October 14, 1943, to the late Joseph W. and Sarah E. (Kinley) Pritt.

One of eleven children, Arnold spent his youth in the rustic hills and hollers of West Virginia. A graduate from East Bank High School with the class of 1961, it was there he met his high school sweetheart and future wife, Ruth. While out one night at the local teenage hangout playing pinball, Ruth took the initiative asking him to walk her home. After graduation, Arnold proudly enlisted in the United States Navy, dedicating three years of service. On October 19, 1963, Arnold and Ruth were united in marriage, spending the next 59 years together. He secured employment with Rolls Royce as a talented electrician, later taking early retirement after 26 years of faithful service.

Originally settling in Indianapolis, the family moved around for a time before being given the opportunity to leave the hustle and bustle of city life, purchasing their forever home on 8 acres in the quiet rural life of Morgan County. In his free time, Arnold enjoyed woodworking, fishing, hunting, strumming his guitar, and playing games. A devout member of the Poplar

Grove United Methodist Church, he was also a Freemason.

Well respected and hardworking, Arnie was a devoted husband, father, and grandfather. A hands-on dad, he was actively involved in his children's life, passing on his abilities to fix anything (If he couldn't fix it, it can't be fixed), while pushing them to be the best they could be. A loving and caring husband, he was a good provider, ensuring Ruth was able to stay home with the kids. In his later years, he found his joy with his beloved grandkids, taking them on wagon rides around the property. Fun spirited and with a sometimes-goofy sense of humor, Arnold left a lasting legacy that will be remembered for generations to come.

Along with his parents, Arnold was preceded in death by his siblings, John Pritt, Lenora Weaver, Judy Butler, Marilyn Dover, Joseph Pritt, and Terry Pritt.

He leaves behind his wife, Ruth Ann (Perry) Pritt of Monrovia; children, Deanna Lynn Harris (Kevin) of Monrovia, Michael Lee Pritt (Jennifer) of New Palestine, and Sheryl Denise Smith (Bill) of Cloverdale; sisters, Betty Parker of Columbus, Mary Eaton of Monrovia, Sandy Gibson of Plainfield, and Sherry Sadler of Charleston, WV; along with 14 grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren.

Cremation and Funeral Arrangements have been entrusted to Light Memorial & Funeral Chapel in Monrovia. Friends and family are invited to gather on Friday, December 30, 2022, from 2pm to 6pm at the funeral home. Arnold will be inurned on Monday, May 8, 2023, at 1pm in Crown Hill National Cemetery, with full Military Honors.. 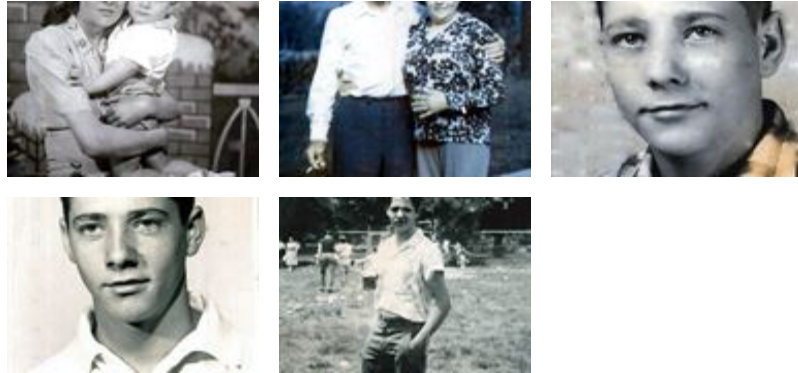
