June 26, 1948 - May 5, 2020

Bill Anderson, 71, of Mooresville, was released of all early ailment and called home to heaven on, Tuesday, May 5, 2020, with his loved ones by his side. He was born on June 26, 1948, in Bowling Green, Kentucky, to the late Elzie and Marjorie (Jordan) Anderson.

Bill went to school in Pittsboro until the age of 16, transferred to Brownsburg, where he graduated in 1966. A modestly proud veteran of the United States Army, Bill bravely enlisted during the Vietnam Era and actively served in Germany under the military police. United in marriage with his high school sweetheart, Perry Lou Hardin; to whom he faithfully shared in 38 years of marriage. Upon Perry's passing, Bill fulfilled her promise and purchased a prized red convertible corvette. Utilizing skills acquired from the military, Bill returned home and landed a job as a deputy for the Hendricks County Sherriff's Department. An avid outdoorsman, trophy hunter and wildlife enthusiast, he tactfully served as the Vice President of sales at Galyan's Trading Post for many years. In addition, Bill was the co-owner of Evernham – Anderson & Associates, operating for 15 years and retiring in 2000.

Setting an example for all, Bill was humble, loyal, generous and an anonymously giving man. A sharp dressed man who always carried icebreakers in his pocket, he was an actively involved member at the Decatur Township Church of Christ. He was a charter member and Golden Eagle of

the NRA and the Indianapolis Zoo. Experiencing a lifetime of hunting and fishing adventures, Bill never met a stranger, he took pride in his home and property and especially the “rec” room, where an extensive gun and game collection was kept on display. Sealing fate and finding a mate to love and cherish the rest of the way, Bill met Susie (Bell) Underhill on a blind date at Starbucks and after a year full of fun and adventure the two were married on November 10, 2012 .

Along with his parents and former spouse, he was preceded in death by his granddaughter, Elaine “Ellie” Chamness, and a brother, Mike Anderson. Survivors include his darlin’ and loving wife, Susie (Bell) Anderson of Mooresville; sister, Janice Anderson of Indianapolis; children, Katie (Underhill) Chamness of Plainfield and Nick Underhill (wife, Ashley) of Mooresville; grandchildren, Gabby and Scarlett Chamness, Lainey, Cali and Levi Dean, along with a host of extended family members, in-laws and friends.

Due to social distancing and current restrictions to prevent further spreading of the virus, the public is encouraged to pay respects over the phone and computer. Services to Celebrate the Life of Bill will be announced once restrictions are lifted. Abiding to guidelines regarding gatherings up to 25 and wearing PPE, family and close friends will gather from Noon to 2pm, on Saturday, May 9, 2020, in Light Memorial & Funeral Chapel, Monrovia, with full military honors and private time for sharing immediately following. Attendees are responsible for providing their mask and kindly asked to wear for the duration of services. Light Memorial will provide hand sanitizer and staff to ensure a safe distance is maintained. Cremation will follow services and an inurnment will be held next to his former spouse in Johnson Family Cemetery in Fayette. 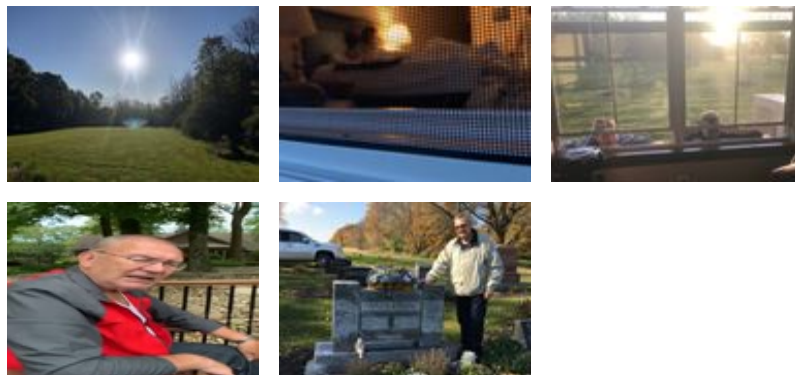

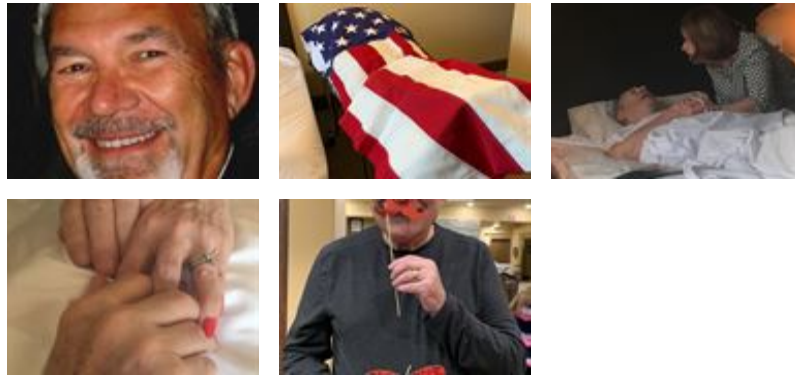
