



## Bruce Wright

December 25, 1951 - June 13, 2026

Bruce Randall Wright, age 74, was released of his brief yet courageous battle with cancer, on Saturday, June 13, 2026, at 2:50 AM, while in the comfort of his own home.

Born on December 25, 1951 in Beech Grove, Indiana, Bruce grew up with a vibrant spirit and a quiet, caring nature. He graduated from Arsenal Technical High School with the Class of 1970. Shortly thereafter, he honorably served his country in the United States Army & Indiana National Guard.

Bruce secured employment with RCA, where he dedicated 27 years to working in consumer electronics manufacturing until 1995. In addition, he was a proud member of the IBEW. Bruce then shifted to the trucking industry, where he worked for Old Dominion, Warner, and On-Line Transport before retiring in 2014.

A quiet and occasionally shy man to those on the outside, Bruce possessed a wonderful, sharp sense of humor and a deep, caring heart for his small, tight-knit circle. He married the love of his life and high school sweetheart, Marilyn Elaine Chambers, on January 21, 1984. The two originally met in high school, later got back together, and shared a beautiful 42-year journey of marriage, settling down in Gasburg in 1987, where they spent the last 39 years building their life together.

Bruce was a man of distinct passions. An avid builder of plastic model kits—particularly cars, planes, and tanks—he shared his craft as a dedicated member of the Circle City Modelers car model club. His love for mechanical detail extended to a passion for NASCAR and racing, which took him on memorable trips to Charlotte Motor Speedway, Raceway Park, and Salem Speedway. A true history enthusiast, he spent countless hours diving into military history, with a particular focus on World War II.

Music was another cornerstone of Bruce's life. He loved hard rock and shared a powerful bond over the music of Black Sabbath and Jimi Hendrix with his step-son, Jeff Caselden, whom he worked hard to connect with and deeply love. Bruce also cherished travel, fondly remembering trips out west to Seattle and San Francisco, as well as a few special journeys to Dublin, Ireland, a place he always loved to visit. At home, he found great comfort in his faith at Gasburg Baptist Church and in the companionship of his beloved Chihuahua fur-babies, Marty and the late, Murphy.

He was preceded in death by the parents who lovingly raised him, Harry L. and Lucy Wright; half-brothers Ronald and Gary Judd; in-laws, Paula Ward and Pamela Williams.

His legacy of quiet strength, humor, and devotion lives on through his beloved wife, Marilyn Wright of Mooresville; son, Jeff Caselden (Mindi) of Mountshannon, Ireland; half-siblings Joyce Perry, Jan Hill, Wayne Judd and their mother Ethel; in-laws, Jerry Walters (Monica) and Jackie Brennan (Danny) both of Salem; and a loving host of nieces, nephews, extended family, and friends.
