Chad Douglas Hall, 51, of Paragon, and formerly of Monrovia, left this world on Monday, January 6, 2025, in his sister Lori's arms after battling several health complications. He was born in Temple, TX on December 13, 1973, to the late Douglas Eugene Hall and Linda Darlene (Faulkenberg) Martin.

The son of an Army man the family moved every three years to accommodate their father's career. When Chad was 5, he took apart the family's lawnmower and put it back together, revealing a glimpse of the talented man he would become. When his mom was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis, she and the kids moved back to their roots in Monrovia to be closer to her parents. His sister Lori took over the parent role watching over her little brothers. Chad attended Monrovia High School with the class of '91 and started his first job as a fuel attendant at the 76 Truck Stop. When he met a guy named Jerome, Chad was taken under his wing and Jerome taught him the art of drywall, a trade that he perfected. He married Denise Stokes and the two were blessed with their first child, Colton. He later became the proud father to Jada, his first daughter. Throughout the years Chad worked for Prock Drywall, Stanley Towing, and was self-employed for many years establishing himself in all aspects of construction. He was truly a jack of all trades.

A generous and kind hearted soul, Chad never judged anyone, treated everyone equally, and was known to help anyone in need of assistance.

Talented, funny, and smart, he was self-taught in many ways and lived life by his own rules. He deeply loved all children, but especially the ones he called his own. A great father, friend, and brother, Chad was a unique person and never caring what others thought of him. His sense of humor was deeply embedded in his heart, and he enjoyed watching *The Whittaker's*. His many hair styles and facial hair styles were unsurpassed. He will be remembered for his big beaming smile, beautiful blue eyes, and the stellar father that he was.

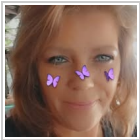
