



## Charles "Alan" Gossett

Charles "Alan" Gossett, 67, of Indianapolis, and formerly of Mooresville, passed from this life while in the care of St. Francis Hospital, Indianapolis, with his loving family by his side. He was born on September 16, 1953, to the late Harold F. and Laura W. (France) Gossett.

The oldest of three boys, Alan began his life in Indianapolis before the family moved to Mooresville, where he spent his youth. He attended Mooresville High School, was the champion member of the chess team until his Junior year, then he completed his education at Ben Davis High School, proudly graduating with the class of 1972.

Born into a family of electricians, Alan was destined to become a Master Electrician, fine tuning his craft while taking over his father's business, Bertram. He was a loyal member of the IBEW #481, retiring at 57 years young.

He wanted the best for his family and loved using his hands to build and install swing sets for the grandchildren to play on. He will be deeply and profoundly missed by all who knew him.

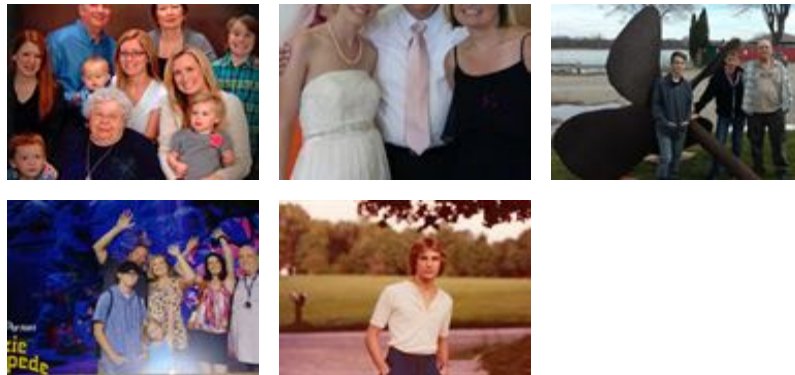
