September 25, 1947 - December 27, 2015

Darryl Eugene Hannah, 68, of Germantown, Tennessee, peacefully passed away Sunday, December 27, 2015. He was born on September 25, 1947, in Martinsville, to the late Verna and Larkin Hannah.

Darryl grew up on the Hannah/Hinshaw farm in Hall where he was instilled with strong values and learned the importance of faith, family, and work. He graduated from Monrovia High School in 1965 and attended Purdue University, where he earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in Aeronautical and Astronautical Engineering. An honorable veteran, Darryl served as a pilot in the United States Air Force during the Vietnam War; continuing on active duty service until 1981. He then joined the Air National Guard, serving until his retirement in 1993. Darryl selflessly dedicated 23 years, 2 months and 2 days of service to his country.

Known for immense compassion and generosity, Darryl loved God and others. He embraced life and thoroughly enjoyed coming back to the farm for visits with family and friends. Even amidst a difficult diagnosis, Darryl persevered with a positive outlook and steadfast trust in God. His tender disposition endures in the hearts of those dear to him.

Darryl is survived by his wife of 43 years, Sylvia (Moulton) Hannah of Tennessee, to whom he was united in marriage on November 25, 1972;

adored daughters, Tobie Robison (husband, Mike) of Mississippi and Dawn Michael of Colorado; beloved grandchildren, Hannah Emily and Michael Robison; brother, Curt Hannah of Florida; and many family members, friends, and classmates in Indiana.

Services held in Tennessee will begin at 11am, on Thursday, December 31, at Riveroaks Reformed Presbyterian Church in Germantown, with visitation held an hour prior.

A Graveside Service will begin at 2:30pm, on Saturday, January 2, 2016, in Mt. Pleasant Cemetery, Hall. Friends and family will gather from 1-2pm at Light Memorial & Funeral Chapel in Monrovia for a brief visitation and follow in a funeral procession that will leave for the cemetery promptly at 2pm. Pastor Richard Dickison will officiate the service and military honors will be conducted.

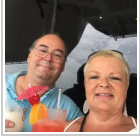
