David "Romain" Day, 92, of Monrovia, passed from this life and into the arms of his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on November 11, 2020, while in the care of The Springs of Mooresville. He was born the oldest child of seven children to the late Alva Burl and Frances Marie (Davis) Day on March 17, 1928 in Nashville, Indiana.

As a young boy, he attended Paragon school, the old Wilbur schoolhouse and Hall school. With a strong work ethic at a young age, Romain went to work for the historic sanitarium in Martinsville. He later secured employment with Chevrolet before retiring from Allison's as a nickel plater at age fifty-two. With a keen sense of humor and a passion for mowing grass, Romain opened a lawn care business with the slogan "We cut your grass, we don't smoke it".

Adored by his siblings, and especially Dottie, Romain could do no wrong. Talented at throwing knives, he once asked Dot to place an apple on her head; he then threw a knife and hit his mark; A story to be told to generations throughout the years.

A soul full of energy, Romain didn't stay in one place long. Always one to enjoy the spotlight, he was a great boxer, danced famously on roller skates and could ride a bicycle backwards. With a thick head full of red hair, he was a true ladies man, wooing in the best of them with his charming demeanor and

contagious smile. A talented guitar player, he enjoyed playing his Gibson acoustic guitar.

Devoutly religious, Romain's deep faith in the Lord never wavered. He was a member of the Gasburg Baptist church and the Eternal Life Baptist Church. A proud and dedicated father, he loved people and especially his family. Romain leaves this world with a legacy of love, light, peace and harmony.

Along with his parents, Romain was preceded in death by his former wives, Pauline Golden Disney and Tommie (Thomas) Day; siblings, Phyllis Sanford and Coleen VanHook; and granddaughter, Mariah Marian McDowell.

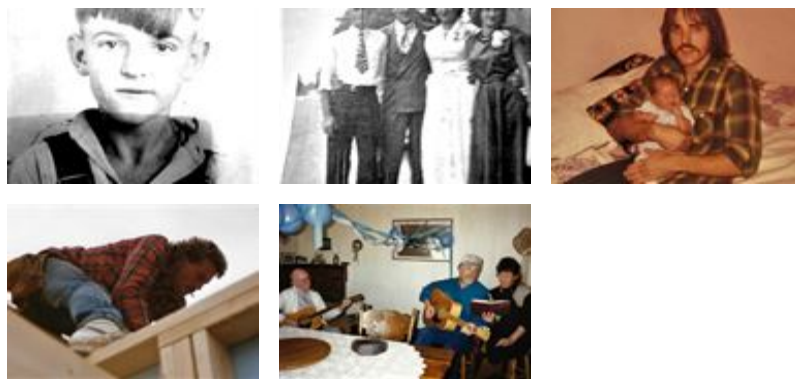

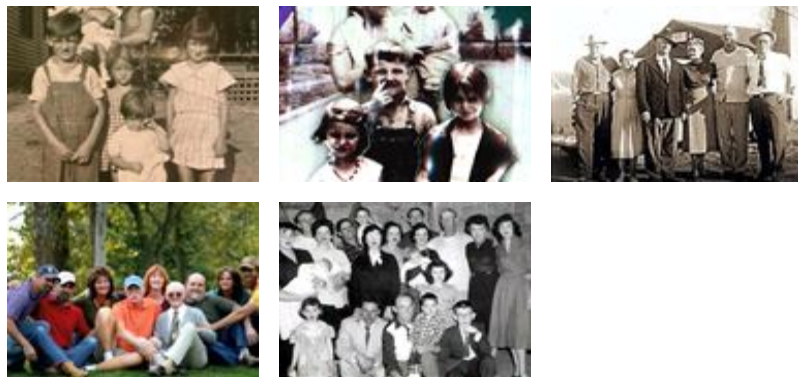
