Derek R. Hall, 48, of Mooresville, passed from this life tragically and without warning in the early morning hours of Saturday, February 1, 2025. He was born in Honolulu, HI on November 12, 1976, to the late Douglas Eugene Hall and Linda Darlene (Faulkenberg) Martin.

The son of an enlisted soldier, Derek's family moved every three years to accommodate their father's career. When his mom was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis, she and the kids moved back to their roots in Monrovia to be closer to her parents. The third born and significantly younger than his older two siblings, Derek, was separated from the family at an early age. This turn of events taught him to become self-sufficient and resilient from an early age. A proud graduate with the class of 1994 from Morton Memorial High School, he immediately got a job working side by side with his brother, Chad, installing and finishing drywall, later securing employment with Beard Masonry in Mooresville, as well as for the Railroad.

Truly a kid at heart, Derek absolutely loved to fish and enjoy the great outdoors. While he was not one to hold value in materialism, he was a collector of all things he was blessed to have, regularly giving his possessions to those in need. He reveled in the simple life, never knew a stranger, and could strike up a conversation with all who were fortunate to cross his path. An excellent cook, he was known to take random ingredients and throw them

together, making a delicious meal (enough to feed an army, even though there weren't that many there to devour his concoctions). Forever accepting and loving, he was known widely in the town of Mooresville. Derek will be forever missed for his endless giggles and heartwarming laughter.

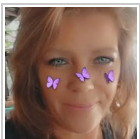
