Donna Jo (Cullings) Belcher, 66, of Stilesville, was released of cancer and peacefully concluded her earthly journey on Monday, February 22, 2021, while under hospice comfort and care in Avon. She was born on November 2, 1954, to Forrest "Jack" Lee Cullings and Elouise "Joan" (Miller) Cullings.

Growing up with one brother in Marion County, Donna was a 1973 graduate of Northwest High School. Ambitious to pursue a career path, she studied radiologic technology at Indiana University School of Medicine and finished her associates in Science in 1975. She was preceded in death by her father, Forrest "Jack" Cullings and recently by her beloved min-pin and fur baby, Becca.
