Georgia Anne Fisher, 85, of Monrovia, Indiana, passed away peacefully on Friday, June 26, 2026, at Allisonville Meadows and was reunited with her beloved husband, Dick, on their 66th anniversary. She was born on January 16, 1941, in Springfield, Illinois, to the late George Holloway Webb and Anne Winona (Cutter) Webb.

A 1958 graduate of Shortridge High School, Georgia was gifted in shorthand and bookkeeping. She worked as a bookkeeper and was known for her dedication, reliability, and strong work ethic. She worked for her son's company, Insight Engineering, for 23 years before retiring. She was an active member of Monrovia Methodist Church, where her faith remained a guiding force throughout her life.

Georgia was the beloved wife of Dick Fisher, whom she met in high school where he lived just two houses away. They were married on June 26, 1960, sharing an extraordinary 65 years of love, devotion, and partnership. In 1971 the pair planted their roots on Gasburg Road where they remained until failing health placed them in a long-term facility. Together they built a life centered on family, faith, and countless adventures.

Above all else, Georgia was devoted to her family. She was a loving wife, mother, grandmother, great grandmother, and friend whose calm and steady

presence brought comfort to everyone around her. She was a natural peacemaker who always looked on the bright side of life. Gentle and reserved, she had a quiet strength that earned the respect and admiration of those who knew her. When it came to raising her children, a simple expression of disappointment was all the discipline she ever needed.

Georgia cared deeply about others and had an incredibly forgiving heart. Though soft-spoken, she possessed a wonderful sarcastic wit that delighted those closest to her. She was an exceptional planner and organizer, carefully scheduling family vacations and preserving memories in binders she lovingly created. She and Dick especially enjoyed traveling, including a memorable three-week trip to California during the nation's Bicentennial celebration in 1976, and visits to New York, Florida, and Washington.

Georgia also enjoyed collecting knick-knacks, attending auctions and antique engine shows with Dick, visiting flea markets, and crocheting. She especially loved finding unique treasures and often donated many of her finds to Goodwill, believing in sharing with others.

Those who knew Georgia will remember her unwavering love for her family, her thoughtful organization, her gentle smile, and her ability to bring peace and kindness into every room she entered. Her legacy of compassion, faith, forgiveness, and quiet strength will continue to live on in the hearts of all who loved her.
