November 13, 1951 - March 2, 2018

Jackie Dean Ferguson, 66, of Monrovia, was cancer free and peacefully called home to heaven at 10:40 a.m. on March 2, 2018 in the comfort of his home. He was born on November 13, 1951 in Martinsville to the late Conrad Yale and Nola Mae (Parrish) Ferguson.

Jackie attended Hall Elementary School and graduated from Monrovia High School in the class of 1970. A typical farm boy, Jackie's upbringing was during a time that was commonly referred to as the glory days, where children were instilled with the meaning of hard work and the value of a dollar. The older sibling by three years, Jackie and his brother, Jerry were a dynamic duo. Driving by the time their feet could reach the pedals, the two had miles upon miles of stomping ground in Hall to explore. Of course, work came first, but after chores were finished, they seized the opportunity to play. This led up to a lifetime of memories and some great ripping and roaring childhood stories.

A pillar within the community, Jackie has been a familiar face in Morgan County for his entire life. After graduation, Jackie set out on a new endeavor where he first drove a truck for Yellow Transit. He worked for a period of time at the telephone company and at the Stilesville Implement Auction. Prior to his illness, Jackie dedicated several years working as a buyer for Ted Everett Farm Equipment Auction. An intelligent, friendly, reputable and honest man, Jackie Ferguson was an experienced and knowledgeable buyer. He was a

humble, kind and genuine man that always willing to go out of his way or lend a hand to someone in need. Highly skilled and experienced in wholesale and retail of farm equipment and truck values, Jackie's outgoing demeanor and fun personality made it easy for him to develop several out-of-state friendships with clients and was always there to help others. A follower of Christ and faithful deacon at church, he was baptized as a child and held a lifetime membership at the Mt. Pleasant Christian Church in Hall. He was past-president and chairman of the Monrovia festival committee; serving and supporting his hometown for over a decade on the Monrovia Festival Civic Association; selling tractor tickets, hosting the annual drawings and setting up and tearing down the lights for festival weekend.

The proud father of one girl and four boys, there was not a thing in this world that he would not do for his children; including coaching and assisting with little league sports. With a bit of struggles in the female relations department, Jackie always managed to get back up. Like the delicacy of aged beef and fine wine, he was blessed to find true love later in life. Having fell for the teller that assisted his father at Citizens Bank, Jackie's life got even better when he found the missing piece. Immediately sparking a friendship that lasted until his last breath, Jackie married his soulmate, Pamela (Freeman) Ferguson on July 3, 2008; to whom both were honored to be named Grand Marshalls in 2014 Monrovia Festival parade. Together, the two were inseparable. Building a forever home with a garage, working together in the flowers beds, taking several trips, attending social gathering and community events, they were hand in hand and remained at each other's side.

Overall, he was a simple man who lived a beautiful and full life. Loved by many and liked by all, it seems unfair to those left behind. At times like this, there's a comfort in knowing that God only takes the best. A courageous battle with cancer, he did not lose. Remaining hopeful and positive, his final wish was granted on Friday morning when he was released of all illness and finally

called home. Deeply loved and sorely missed, Jackie Ferguson was not just a good guy; he was one of the best.

Along with his parents, Jackie was preceded in death by his oldest child and only daughter, Angela Ferguson Lynch.

Survivors include his loving wife and best friend, Pamela (Freeman) Ferguson; sons, Jackie Jr. of Brooklyn, New York and Dustin, Dallas (wife, Sarah) and Matthew Ferguson all of Monrovia; brother, Jerry Ferguson (wife, Carol); grandchildren, Joseph and Tiffany Lynch, Michael and Aisley Ferguson; great grandson, Eric; an adored four-legged canine companion, Nola; along with a host of cherished friends and colleagues.

Friends and family will gather for the viewing to pay their final respects from 2 to 7p.m., on Tuesday, March 6, 2018, at Light Memorial & Funeral Chapel in Monrovia. The cremation will take place after calling and a Memorial Celebration of Life Service will begin at 2:00p.m., on Wednesday, March 7, 2018, at the funeral home. Jackie's truck will lead the procession to inurnment in Mt. Pleasant Cemetery, Hall. Following the funeral dinner at church, friends are invited for fellowships and snacks at an informal social gathering at the Rhea's farm, located on State Road 42 before Hall Road. 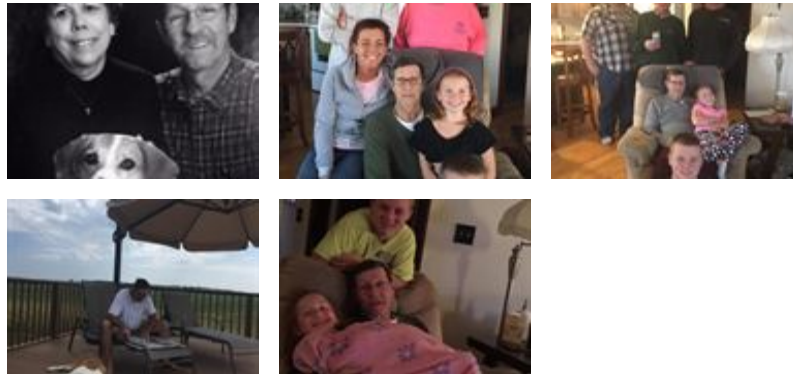
