James Alsup, 70, of Indianapolis, left this world unexpectedly on Wednesday, February 19, 2025. He was born in Martinsville, IN on October 25, 1954, to the late Charles and Willa Mae (Marlow) Alsup.

Living most of his adult life in Mars Hill, James could be found on Friday and Saturday nights at the West Newton ball diamonds playing on a pre-pro league baseball team and was ready to move up to the pro league with his innate talent. Not one to start a conversation, but when engaged he was all in. A quiet and reserved man, James became the devoted caregiver for his mother while she was in failing health, and his love for her was utterly abundant.
