April 30, 1941 - April 16, 2019

Alice “Kay” (Jones) Hobson, a devoted Jehovah’s Witness, 77 years old, of Monrovia, was released from her debilitating battle against Alzheimer’s disease and gained eternal peace at 1:13 pm, on Tuesday, April 16, 2019, while comfortably surrounded by loved ones in Plainfield at Gathering Together. The youngest child of eight, Kay was born on April 30, 1941, in Brazil Indiana, to the late Charles and Edna (Myers) Jones.

A coal miners daughter, Kay acquired a multitude of skillful talents during her childhood that led her to lead a full and meaningful life. Attending elementary school in Brazil, her father prematurely passed when she was eight years old which relocated her family towards Indianapolis with their step father, Carl Spencer; to whom she generously served as a caretaker during the end of his life.

Brought together by fate, the story of Kay and Larry Hobson first began at a graduation ceremony they both were attending. Introduced by a mutual friend, the Hobson’s were united in marriage on June 1, 1957, in Mooresville. The couple settled on his family’s farm on Gordon Road in Monrovia. In addition to traveling to various places with her husband and their neighbors and good friends, Gloria and Roger Gates, Kay always looked forward to going to the Van Buren

class of 1959 reunions'. She began working in the jewelry department of Walmart, which later afforded her the training to set stones and do engraving at Herff Jones in Indianapolis for ten years. In addition, she later became the filing clerk in the retirement service file unit where she worked at One America (formerly AUL) for three years before retiring.

Above all, Kay was a nurturing, loyal, spunky, kind, and classy woman. Full of grace and spice, she was an excellent cook, host, travel companion and fun person to be around. She had a sharp eye for measurements, and her recipes were kept only in her memory. Everyone agreed her cherry cheesecake was next to none. She possessed a selfless compassion for all people and animals. Some of her beloved pets include Kiaya, Kayak, Teddy Black Jack and Tommy. With tiny frame and mighty pride, Kay was a lady who's unwavering ability's stood head and shoulders above the rest. Whether it be butchering 24 chickens in a day or reeling in ginormous barracudas and mahi-mahi on vacation. She took pride in the earth and found her greatest joys in making her own clothes, planting flowers, canning vegetables from her garden, hunting mushrooms, and sometimes just going fishing. A woman of purpose, Kay's bright cheerful demeanor and warming presence was welcomed by all. Experiencing a full and adventurous life, Kay will be greatly missed by all who were blessed to know and love her. 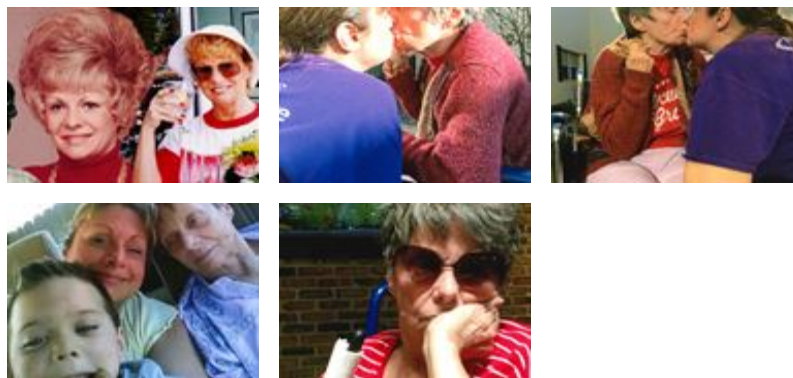
