Kimberly Ann “Kim” (Wolf) Thorsen, 62, of Indianapolis, left this world suddenly and unexpectedly on Friday, February 13, 2026. She was born in Alamogordo, NM on August 23, 1963, to the late William “Bill” and Sharon (Lime) Cummings.

A graduate with the class of 1981 from Decatur Central High School, Kim played clarinet in the band. She was blessed with her first son, Nick, a couple of years after graduation. While working as a cook at Gary’s Restaurant and Bar, she met her future husband Jon, and they were united in marriage in 1991, completing the family of four when Jon III came along.

Hardworking, Kim was a dedicated employee at Get Go, devoting 8 years of service to the company. She made a connection with her customers, and in turn, they felt the same about her. She loved going to concerts, rocking out to her favorite classic rock bands. Protective of her little sister Angel, she deeply adored her family and reveled in spending the holidays with them. She was most proud to be the mother of her two boys, even though she was a thorn in their side at times. She could regularly be found glued to her phone playing Monopoly and Yahtzee. She possessed quite the memory, recalling dates and clothing that people wore flawlessly. Although Kim didn’t have much, she was known to give you whatever she could to lighten your burden. A city girl at heart, she could be ornery, loving, had a keen and sometimes dark sense of

humor. Leaving this world all too soon, she will remain in the hearts of those who were lucky enough to know and love her.

Along with her parents, Kim was preceded in death by her brothers, Robert Risk Jr and Steven Risk.

She leaves behind her two sons, Nickolas "Nick" Wolf (Heidi) of Monrovia, and Jon Thorsen III of Carmel; siblings, Angie "Angel" Napier (Tim) of Coatsville, Gregory Cummings (Jennie) of Mooresville, David Cummings (Kim) of Mooresville, and Rick Cummings (Diana) of Indianapolis; several nieces and nephews; and her beloved grand dog, ESPN.
