



## Lisa Fairfield

April 19, 1958 - December 12, 2020

Lisa Dawn (Baker) Fairfield, 62, of Monrovia, was granted the peace of eternal rest in hospice care at The Gathering Together in Plainfield at 4:28 am, on Saturday, December 12, 2020, due to complications sustained after multiple surgeries were performed on a brain aneurysm that was found in June. The oldest child, born on April 19, 1958, in Linton, Indiana, to the loving parents, Richard and Mignon Sue (Donahue) Baker.

Raised in Hendricks County, Lisa graduated from Plainfield High School with the class of 1976. Lisa met Rick while hanging out at the local Burger Chef and from there they blended to share the ins and outs of their 43 year story of memories' past. The two were united in marriage on August 20, 1977 and began their happy family; claiming their first Ryan, followed with a daughter Christa, then claimed it perfect after having Nick; to whom she would follow to the ends of the earth and do things that only the best of mothers would do.

Possessing a deep love for horses from a very young age, her heart was imprinted by hooves and she dreamed for the day that she would get to have horses of her own. With her daughter also sharing that love, she afforded the opportunity a bit later in life, where Lisa was loyally committed to caring, riding, showing and loving each of them. Most happy when surrounded by natures beauty, her family holds dear to past times when camping and mudding in the side by sides. A fiercely proud, protective and supportive

mother, Lisa was always actively involved with the children's extracurricular activities. She was a member of the MHS Football Boosters and was past president of the Golden Spur saddle club.

Lisa was a dedicated, loving, and proud wife, mother, sister, grandma, and friend to all that took part within her circle and in the small town and community in which she was willing to invest interest and greatly valued. She previously worked 10 plus years at the Walmart in Plainfield , she was currently a school bus driver for Monroe-Gregg Schools and was the master crafter and creative natured entrepreneur to successfully own and operate the first floral shop in Monrovia. Determined to follow her dreams she opened her first store front shop on Main Street in 2014 before deciding to upgrade and expand business to Chestnut St. next to ball diamonds.

Along with her father, Lisa was preceded in death by her brothers-in-law, Tom Weatherman, and Rusty Fairfield.

Along with her mother, Mignon Sue Baker of Plainfield, survivors include her husband of 43 years, Rick Fairfield of Monrovia; children, Ryan Fairfield (Summer) of Camby, Christa Fortner (Brandon) of Quincy, and Nick Fairfield (Emily) of Bainbridge; siblings, Lauri Weatherman of Camby, Tim Baker of Plainfield, and Lana Sweeney (Jennifer George) of Spencer; grandchildren, Dakota, Chase, and Landon; along with nieces and nephews, Rachel, Elicia, Ashley, Derek, Sean, and Nicole; and in-laws, Robin Donaldson (Kevin); along with a host of extended family members, lifelong friendships, colleagues and acquaintances within the community.

Funeral and Cremation Arrangements were entrusted into the care of Light Memorial & Funeral Chapel in Monrovia. While the holidays have come and passed and pandemic vaccinations are now available, service details have been finalized and are as follows, but still have restrictions. Due to current

county and state COVID-19 guidelines, public gatherings have been limited to contain no more than 25 people. 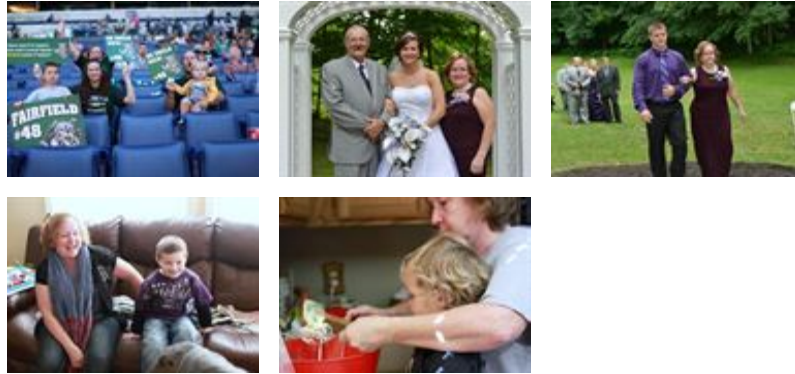

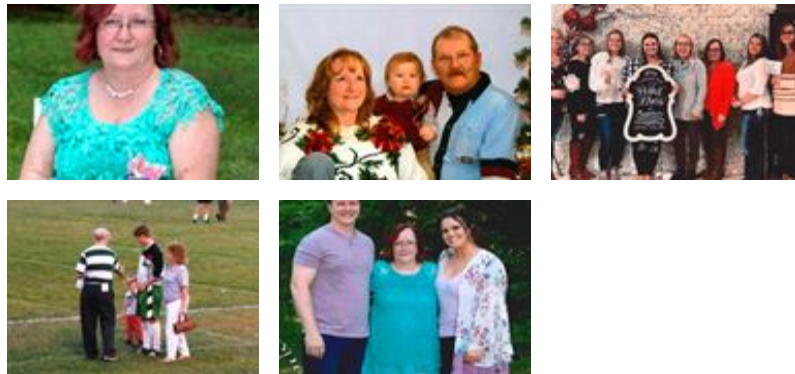
