Noah William Young, 86, of Monrovia, passed away Tuesday, May 19, 2026, while surrounded by the two women he loved most. He was born on April 20, 1940, in Hyden, Kentucky, to the late Dan and Tempie (Collins) Young.

Raised in the hills of Kentucky, Noah learned the value of hard work at an early age.
