She loved to go waterskiing and would have Harold pull her for miles. A woman that was also beautiful on the inside, her compassionate personality was one of a kind. The proud and loving parents of four children, the Adams raised their children in Morgan County and briefly in Peru. After Harold retired from Chrysler, they built a forever home and enjoyed caring for their property, home and spending time with their grand babies. to her four children, Peggy worked with insurance companies. Capable of multi-tasking, she was a 4-H Leader for many years and girl scout and brownie troop leader for over twenty years. She was also a room mother for each of her kids and volunteered with the PTA committee and Peru Home Economics Club. Full of zest and passionate about life, Peggy was tiny yet mighty. A real-life superwoman, she did not hold back; never letting her fears get in the way. She enjoyed cooking, baking, hosting and entertaining at family get-to-gathers and always made sure that everyone ate. Peggy never met a stranger and was even known to engage in conversation with those who crossed her path.

Possessing a compassionate level of kindness, she was notoriously known to give second and even third chances to those in the wrong.
