



## Robert "Bud" Bilyeu

March 28, 1938 - February 14, 2018

Robert "Bud" Bilyeu, 79, of Monrovia, sadly passed away at 4:30a.m., on Wednesday, February 14, 2018, in his residence. He was born on March 28, 1938, in Indianapolis, to the late Paul Vernon and Berniece (Aubrey) Bilyeu.

Bud graduated from Washington High School in 1956. He entered Boy Scouts at a young age, where he was affiliated with Troop #83, and proudly achieved "Eagle Scout" status in 1952. He dedicated fifteen years of service to Yellow Freight, before relocating to Smith Brothers for seven years and most recently, he worked at the Home Depot on the west side of Indianapolis as a greeter. A tremendously talented builder and creative artist, Bud was also a quick-witted jokester and eccentric storyteller.

Bud had a smooth and charming demeanor and like a fine wine, he did not find true love until later in life. He was united in marriage to his soulmate, love and best friend, Evelyn Mae, on October 16, 1987. Together, with strong will and ambition, Bud and Evelyn purchased property in Monrovia. Solely responsible for drawing, designing, and building their forever home, he took great pride in his work and property. Bud's idea of a perfect day was spent working on various projects around the home and yard with Evelyn. Always up for a challenge, Bud liked to surprise his loved ones with sentimental gifts that he made with his own hands.

Bud had a great love and respect for animals. One day he saved an injured baby squirrel from its demise. He named him Sugar and built a deluxe enclosure which included elastic waistbands from his old underwear for Sugar to swing on. Sugar was a happy boy and lived 15 years. Through the years, Bud was surrounded by cats. One such cat is Bandit: who never left Bud's side and continues to grieve.

A thick-skinned, ornery, smooth talker, he bore a ginormous heart and loved interacting with people. With a superior level of confidence, a congenial way with words and several exaggerated facial expressions, this man could sell ice to an Eskimo and could talk his way through any situation. Not to be questioned, there wasn't any other way, Bud did it his way and it was guaranteed, he held his own. There was never a dull moment with him around and no one could begin to predict the next words out of his mouth. Living a full and enthusiastic life, he didn't know the definition of quitting or giving up. When his quality of life was altered with heart problems, Bud Bilyeu still managed to spread laughter and shed light when troubled. He couldn't be held back from embracing each day. He had an unforgettable smile and larger-than-life persona. Although Bud can now peacefully rest, his sudden passing has left a huge void in everyone's heart.

Along with his parents, he was preceded in death by a sister, Dixie Watson.

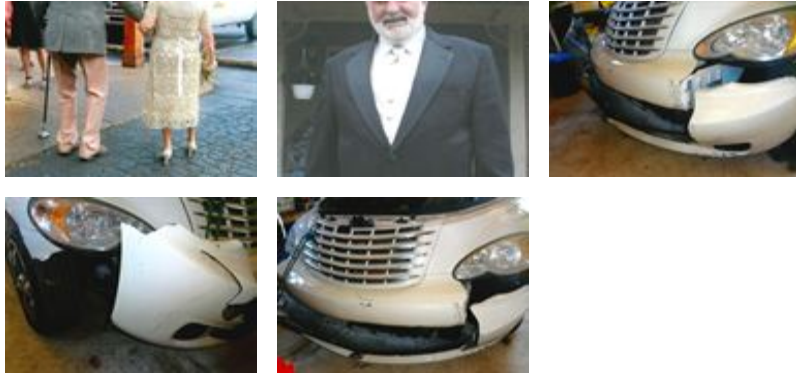
