Ronnie Kay (Harris) Glassburn, 57 years young, of Monrovia, was released of earthly ailments and gained her right to fly in spirit of the sky, on Tuesday, January 29, 2019, while under hospice care in her daughter's home in Martinsville. A stronghearted and boisterous woman, she promised to leave this world in the same manner that she entered; kicking and screaming and Ronnie did just that; checking out at 3:33 p.m. One of four children, she was born in Indianapolis, on February 18, 1961, to Richard and Rose (Lloyd) Harris.

Learning to talk while briefly residing in Georgia, Ronnie's roots were planted in Monrovia and she was raised in the green house on State Road 42. An energetic and overall happy person, she radiated good vibes and thoroughly loved striking up conversations with good people that she instantly considered to be friends.
