Tina JoAnn (Renner) Eminger, 69, of Cloverdale, passed peacefully from this life in the early morning hours of Sunday, December 21, 2025, while in the care of Community South Hospital. She was born in Fort Wayne on Christmas Day, 1955, to Robert Eugene Renner and Shirley M. (Briggs) Lewis.

An entrepreneur of sorts, Tina was a true natural at her various ventures, tackling any task or challenge that came her way, mastering it beautifully. 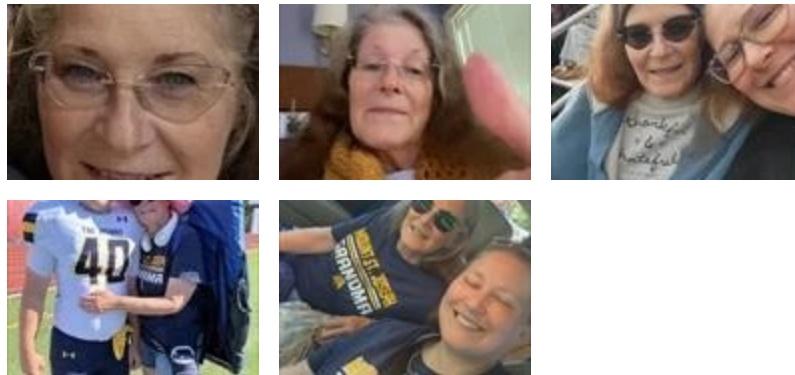

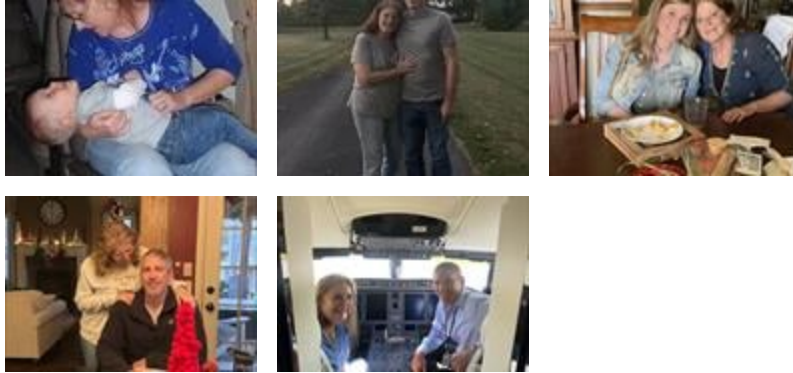
