November 22, 1949 - February 24, 2019

Victoria Kathryn (Chittick) Mayes Seward, 69, of Clayton, passed away at 7:11 p.m., on Sunday, February 24, 2019, after an aneurysm suddenly ruptured while in recovery from heart surgery at Methodist Hospital, Indianapolis. The eldest child, she was born on November 22, 1949, in Lafayette, to John and Marjorie (Weaver) Chittick.

A 1968 graduate of Carroll County High School, Tory attended Ball State University and there she was introduced to Larry Mayes. Tory and Larry united in marriage and were blessed with three children.
